



Background

- The Ohio Healthy Youth Environments Survey (OHYES!) is a **self-reported** adolescent survey administered in all schools, grades 7 through 12, across Ohio, beginning in the fall of 2015
- The OHYES! is designed to gather information on the following health risk and protective factors facing Ohio's young people:
 - Alcohol, Tobacco & Vapor Products
 - Marijuana
 - Prescription Drugs
 - Bullying
 - Safety and Violence
 - Physical Health & Well-being
 - Sexual Behavior & Suicide (*optional*)
 - Mental Health
 - School Climate & Safety
 - Gambling, Family & Peer Factors
 - School Success
 - Community Environment
 - Demographics
- The OHYES! is a collaboration of the Ohio Departments of Education, Health, and Mental Health & Addiction Services, & representatives from Ohio National Guard, higher education, & juvenile courts
- The OHYES! will be administered online every 4 years; however, more frequent use may be approved
- Administration is easy using the online format and the survey takes students about 15 minutes

Benefits

- The OHYES! measures key risk and protective factors that strongly contribute to substance use and provides information relevant to securing funds for prevention and health programs
- Easy-to-reports on Ohio Network of Care and Ohio Department of Health Data Warehouse
- Training and technical assistance is available for interpreting data and using the results
- Local results can be compared with county, statewide and national figures and to see trends over time
- The OHYES! allows schools to assess youth needs, track progress toward physical, social and mental health goals, and evaluate student support services
